## A View from the Courtyard

Dear Friends,

As I was showering the morning that I am writing this article, I found myself thinking about the passage of time. (I was running late!)

I remember how when I was growing up, I would hear adults comment "the time went so fast." I would think to myself, "Oh come on. Time is time. It hasn't gone any faster than it did before."

I was right, of course; time doesn't go slower or faster given our place in life. And yet, now in my fiftieth year (how in the world did that happen?!) -- in other words I'm 49 -- I somehow understand far better what those adults meant. From a subjective standpoint, from the perspective within our own skins, time can seem to pass slowly or quickly. For me it depends on what I'm doing, how enjoyable it is, how engaging it is, how busy I am; I haven't been "bored" in a long time, but that surely makes time "move" more slowly from a subjective perspective.

I find there are analogies to prayer in this experience. When I am engaged with prayer, when my heart and mind are truly present to Jesus -- I experience something different than when they are not. Sometimes what I experience is "mountaintop"; at other times, nowhere near the top of the mountain. But the time is nonetheless different to me; I am shaped differently by that time than when my mind (and therefore my heart) has trouble focusing. I experience the time as going faster when I am engaged with God in this way, yes; but it's also true that the passage of time is no longer important to me.

I always find that holding something in my hands -- a crucifix, or prayer beads of one type or another -- helps me to focus, helps to bring my mind and heart in line with where I am tactually present. (I bet with so many academics among us, I'm not the only one who occasionally finds his mind far from where he is physically present!)

One of my prayers for 2010 is that we might find ourselves present to our neighbors in new ways, in ways that remind us that Jesus is always present to us; and that our neighbors might be so present to us as well. God's blessings in the new year,

- ✘ Adopted a balanced budget for 2010.
- ✘ Appointed an Audit Committee (Susan Steinegger, Michelle Waite, Leroy Svec, and Anne Puls)

*These past few weeks have gone by at breakneck speed. It's probably due to two things: me being new here at St. Mark's on the Campus and getting accustomed to the new environment and ministries, and also to the time of the year. To me, the time from October to New Year's, the last quarter of the year, is a whirlwind. Superimpose the mad rush of commercialized secular activities on top of the beautiful unfolding of the sacred season of Advent and one has – chaos!*

*But now it is a new year and a new semester. The weather gods were not kind to us earlier in December, dumping a blizzard on Lincoln during the same week as the scheduled inaugural "launch" of our new Wednesday evening student-oriented service, Space, and the subsequent cancelling of all activities. Reluctantly, the service had to be postponed until after the holidays, but we are hoping for a successful lift-off starting on Wednesday evenings in January!*

*Another new activity for the New Year is the long-anticipated (by me) college Bible study which we are calling, "The Non-Bible Thumper's Bible Study: an alternative for the rest of us." Jointly offered by Cornerstone Ministries and St. Mark's on the Campus, I envision this as a refreshing student-driven alternative to the many Bible studies that are considerably more force-fed, both in methodology and theology. Although we will start with the New Testament Letter of James, which is a nice, short, and practical book, where we head will be influenced by the interests of those who attend. No restrictions as to the number of participants, and no restraints as to the range of discussions. That's Tuesday evenings at 7, starting on January 12, here in the Lounge at St. Mark's, and continuing for the rest of the school year.*

# The Warden's Words - Bob Kuzelka, Sr. Warden

## "Stewardship by another Name"

Many thanks to the 39 parishioners who took part in the 2009 Ministry Survey for Saint Mark's on the Campus. Only two of the respondents indicated no current involvement in ministries. Sixteen wanted to try some additional ministries and 21 were content with their current stewardship areas. Of those now performing ministries most were involved in one (10) or two to four (7 each). Two of our ministers who really deserve undying gratitude were involved in nine each. The respondents wanting to try some new ministries are interested in a wide range of service with altar assistance receiving the most volunteers (8). Names of those interested in exploring new ministries will be provided to the appropriate committee chairs before the first of the year.

## Another thought on Stewardship.

When I turned 60 (over a decade ago) I decided to quit serving as Rector's Helper and Acolyte. This prompted one fellow SMOCer to ask, "Are you leaving Saint Mark's?" Of course the answer was no, just as it will be when I finish my current stint as Senior Warden. A desire to change, possible "burnout" or changes in either physical or spiritual life situations should not be immediately read as "quitting in disgust or protest" or "resignation." I have often advocated that all of our ministries should have "term limits" similar to those for vestry membership (3 years) or wardens (1 year). At the end of the "term" one could "reup" or look for new areas of service.

## One last CHANCE to dedicate a Memorial Window.

Starting on January 3rd and for the next four Sundays you may purchase five dollar lottery tickets one of which if drawn at the Annual Meeting on January 24th would allow you to dedicate the unsold last half of a Memorial Stain Glass Window in the Nave. There is no limit to the number of tickets any person or family can buy. One hundred forty tickets need to be sold to complete the financial obligations for the windows. Any sales receipts over that will go towards the Pantry. The winning ticket will be drawn at the Annual Meeting on the 24th and the ticket holder or their representative must be present at the drawing to win.

### Contemplative Student Liturgy

We are excited to announce a new Wednesday night student-focused liturgy. The service, called **SPACE**, will be a contemplative liturgy based on the Order for Evening Worship, but will be in many ways a brand-new type of service. We wanted to develop a liturgy that called on the strengths of this church -- both the Episcopal tradition and our own St. Mark's congregation. We also wanted to offer students something that would be of direct and immediate use to them. In conversations over the course of the fall, we came to feel that a contemplative evening service, including silent prayer and meditation, was something that could really benefit students in their daily lives. The service will take a less "formal" approach to the church space: participants will be sitting on cushions in the front of the church. Our music director, Kurt Knecht, is writing new musical settings (including a setting of the *Phos Hilaron*, a beautiful evening prayer), and there will be the use of projected multimedia. In some ways, this will be a "contemporary" service, but it will also be a liturgy steeped in the monastic tradition. We are very excited to see what this will become, and invite you to check it out, and especially to get the word out among students that you may know. The debut of **SPACE** will be on **Wednesday, January 13th, at 7:00 pm.**
